Baskets Needed

One of our main fundraising efforts for the SOAR 8 Convention will be a basket raffle. The Suncoast Intergroup is requesting that all groups consider donating a basket, which will be raffled at the convention. Baskets should be filled with **items that support recovery/abstinence.** In lieu of a basket, monetary donations are gratefully accepted; Intergroup can purchase the items to fill a basket on behalf of your group. Ideas for baskets which are usually popular include:

Summer (beach towel, sunscreen, flip flops, sunglasses)

Spring (gardening tools, seeds, watering can, umbrella)

Fall (scarves, hats and gloves, cozy socks, fall themed décor items)

Winter (scarves, hats and gloves, winter themed décor)

Spa or Mani/Pedi: (Candles, bubble bath, lotions, nail polishes, spa robe, body scrubs, nail files)

Car-Care: (soap, sponges, tire cleaner, wax, chamois, etc.)

Home Improvement: (measuring tape, hammer, nails, duct-tape, screwdriver, etc.)

Writing/Literature: (OA-approved Literature, journal or notepaper, pens or pencils, etc.)

Adult Coloring: (adult coloring books, markers, colored pencils, etc.)

Tools for Abstinence: (measuring cups, spoons, scale, water bottle, tupperware, etc.)

"We are not a Glum Lot" Basket: (board games, word searches, Sudoku, etc)

* All Baskets should include at least 1-piece of OA Approved Literature *

And don't forget to "Think outside the basket!" "Basket" items can be packaged in many creative vessels (e.g. placing items for a care-care kit in a big plastic bucket, placing items with a summer theme in a large mesh beach bag.) In addition, large single items can be raffled off individually (e.g. food processor.)

Donated baskets/donations should be given to an Intergroup Member. No later than October 9th would be ideal, but we will accept Baskets and/or monetary donations up until the day of the Convention.
